

Important information for former STEP/Mondo and eAssessment schools

As planned, NC DPI has provided Harcourt Rigby book sets (68 books each) for your classrooms that continued to use STEP, Mondo, or eAssessment kits in the 2010-11 school year. You should begin using these books at the Beginning-of-Year benchmark assessment this Fall, for the 2011-12 school year. This year's End-of-Year benchmark assessment should be done using the same books you have used this year.

Former eAssessment schools:

You may continue to use the eAssessment books in the benchmark assessment as an additional resource to the 68-book set if you wish.

Former STEP and Mondo schools:

For 2010-11, in order to support both STEP / Mondo and Harcourt Rigby in your school, Wireless Generation created an "Intermediate" school to house your upper grade students using the Harcourt set. Within mCLASS, your original "Elementary" school remained in place and housed your lower grade students assessed with STEP or Mondo books.

This configuration will no longer be necessary next school year. Wireless Generation will remove the Intermediate school from your configuration this Fall, and the Elementary School will remain to reflect your true brick-and-mortar situation.

Next Steps:

1. Using **Self-Service Enrollment**, the district or school should roster all staff and students using mCLASS: Reading 3D into the *Elementary* School. Because the Intermediate School does not reflect your brick-and-mortar set-up, staff and students should no longer be rostered there. Please note the following as you enter your rosters for the new year:
 - a. Students that were previously in the intermediate school will automatically be transferred into the Elementary School. All assessment history will automatically follow the student.
 - b. Staff that were previously in the Intermediate School will receive an automated email upon being rostered into the Elementary school. This email will provide their new username and allow them to set their password. Staff remaining in the elementary school will retain their original username and password. As some of these staff may have been duplicates of a staff member at the Elementary school, they may ignore their new username/password if they already have one for the Elementary School.
 - c. Note: For the automatic transfers to be possible, Self-Service Enrollment must be used (versus manual enrollment). 2. As you may already be familiar, Wireless Generation transitions your schools to the new school year each summer. This process is called roll-over, changing the school-year to 2011-12, promoting students to the next grade, and allowing your staff and student rosters to be updated for 2011-12. Upon roll-over, Wireless Generation will automatically change your mCLASS:

Reading 3D booklist to the Harcourt Rigby set. You should no longer use the STEP and Mondo books for benchmark assessment as of this Fall. We recommend you keep these books to use in the classroom for other literacy activities. You may use them for Progress Monitoring, using the Add-a-Book feature. This feature can be used to progress monitor with any book not in the mCLASS literacy library and record the reading record statistics (book name, book level, errors, time) to determine proficiency.
